A list of *OTC Facts to Consider* is being developed. Watch for it in a future issue of our Newsletter. Hopefully it will prove of value when discussing OTCs with relatives and friends. It is focused on those considering buying a hearing aid Over-the-Counter.

Our **Initiatives** are continuing. We are introducing HLAA through libraries and senior residences. Health Fairs are back; and we are rekindling efforts to get more locations looped. Also, notably, HLAA assistance is being taken into the inner city of Rochester again...through introduction at Charles Settlement House/Community Place

The NYSA Conference sessions at Glens Falls in September provided valuable input to chapters across New York State. Perhaps more collaborative sharing will develop as a result. The carefully planned conference, held for the first time in many years, had no scheduling or technical glitches. A NYS A conference periodically, every few years, is a good objective for consideration.

Our **Strategic Planning** was put in mothballs during the pandemic. We'll be rejuvenating our planning looking three years into the future. As we emerge from the pandemic our situation is much

different than before we were locked down. We have learned how to use on-line meetings effectively and continue to refine our capabilities. We also find our members more accepting of using the new technologies, but we still respect the benefits of in-person gatherings. As much as possible we'll have hybrid offerings. We also will consider how best to deploy these new capabilities to reach and help as many members, and potential members, as possible.

The new ability to collaborate with other chapters across our country will be explored. All this in an environment of emerging technologies coupled with new legislation which promise to be disruptive to the old order of hearing aid dispensing. We'll be adding the additional challenge of tackling on-going sustainability of our chapter as part of the effort.

Veteran's Day is November 11th. Honor Flight Network currently serves veterans from the WWII, Korean War and Vietnam War eras and terminally ill veterans from any era. Honor Flight's mission is to celebrate America's veterans by inviting them to share a day of honor at our nation's memorials in Washington, D.C. at no cost to the veteran. Participation in an Honor Flight trip gives them the opportunity to share this occasion with other comrades, to remember friends and comrades lost, and to share their stories and experiences with other veterans. Veterans invite a guardian to accompany them. Guardians, who cannot be a spouse or over 70, pay a fee to offset their own costs.

The Honor Flight Network was formed in 2005 with a mission of honoring veterans by bringing them to Washington, D.C. to visit the memorials and monuments dedicated to their service and sacrifice. It is a national network comprised of independent hubs working together in furtherance of the Honor Flight

mission. Today the Honor Flight Network comprises over 128 hubs, ten of which are in New York State. Since 2005 Honor Flight Network has taken 251,743 veterans to Washington, D.C. The Rochester Honor Flight hub had trips on October 1st and October 22nd of this year

HLAA-NYS Conference a Success

Justin Osmond of the musical Osmond family, was the inspiring keynote speaker at the HLAA-NY State Association conference at the Queensbury Hotel in Glens Falls, NY September 16-18. His talk was the introduction to a successful weekend that was attended by close to 100 people.



Other speakers included, Dr. Mary Sano, who delivered a well-received presentation Saturday morning on Cognitive Health in Aging: Considerations for those with Hearing Loss.

Dr. Sano's presentation was followed by a discussion of advocacy and legislation, led by NYC chapter member, Jerry Bergman, who highlighted the importance of lobbying Governor Hochul to sign the already-ratified NYS bill for a NYS Commission for Deaf, Deaf-blind, and Hard of Hearing.

Saturday afternoon, Dr. Kevin Franck, chair of the board of National HLAA, gave an interesting update on research and development in hearing technology. The final presenters of the weekend were a panel of audiologists from the NYS Capital Region: Dr. Donna Wayner, Dr. Cara Bedore, Dr. Angela Lalla, and Dr. Debra Trees. The four discussed cochlear implants, the influence of hearing loss on health and interpersonal relationships. They also gave an update on hearing aids and Bluetooth technology. In addition to the excellent presentations, the weekend included an exhibit hall, a silent auction, a comedian, and a steamboat ride on Lake George.

Assistive Listening Device Demo Center

Previous visitors have been very appreciative of the attention and help they received. There are few places



where people with a hearing loss can go to get instant help and quality free information! Lifespan's generosity, in so many ways, combined with the hard work and contribution of so many volunteers really makes a difference!

The types of devices represented during the demo sessions include signaling-alerting devices, captioned telephones and personal assistive listening devices [with an emphasis on TV listening and coping with noisy environments]. This season, several new, lower cost devices will be shown; including our new self-serve hearing

Sessions are usually on the 3rd Thursday of the month. The next demo session at Lifespan, 1900 S. Clinton Ave. (Tops Plaza) on Thursday, November 17th from 10am to 2pm. Sessions are free. All are welcome!




